Message from the President



It will undoubtedly not have escaped your notice that our family foundation has sailed a very quiet course in recent years. When we met in that beautiful summer of 1997 with more than 400 Somsens, coming from many countries such as Germany, Greece, Portugal, Norway and the USA, at the place of our roots, we were able to experience a large number of years of enormous vitality. What wonderful experiences we have shared with each other. I will not lose myself in a complete list here, but I would like to bring a few to your attention. Every five years we organized reunions. Alternately in the Netherlands and the USA. All great. And for years we have held our Somsen camping weekends in IJzerlo, the place of our origin. What a party they were. And not to forget the beautiful boat trips on our rivers with accompanying visits to ancient cities. But the ravages of time have also made their influence felt in our foundation. After 20 years in which Theo Somsen [227] and myself have each been able to wield the gavel with great pleasure for about 10 years each, we had to contend with different times. There were gaps in the old generation and fortunately a younger generation, Oscar Somsen [2040], kept our foundation afloat for a number of years, but in that same youthful generation there was no possibility of continuing with it. This is absolutely not a reproach but has a lot to do with the developments in our society.

Theo, Harry Somsen [146] and I then agreed to take over again to try to guide our foundation into the new era. Harry has done a great job but unfortunately, he is no longer with us. Theo has also been an excellent engine in recent years, and I have only been able to make a minimal contribution due to medical circumstances.

Yet luck also smiles on us. Dirk Somsen [136], the son of Dick Somsen [130], our genealogy expert, has taken over all his father's files after his death and is willing to take it seriously. And can assure you that he tackles this with gusto. He, together with two nephews, both grandchildren of Dick [130], has given the website a new face and has also made other positive changes. Thanks also to these grandsons of Dick: Mark de Groot [138] and Tom de Groot [139]. And we can also count ourselves lucky with Berto Somsen [423] who has previously held a place on our board. He has joined us again and we are very pleased about that.

You may already know that we will continue to send our family magazine only digitally. For this it is necessary that we have as many e-mail addresses as possible of Somsens and related Somsens. Send us as many as possible: info@somsen.org In this way, we can let the fire burn for quite a few years until perhaps a new impetus arises in later generations, because it would be a shame if so many research results just disappear.

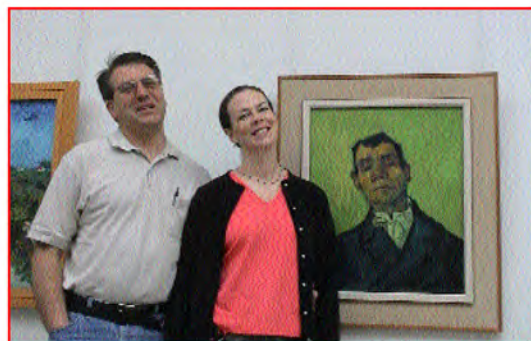

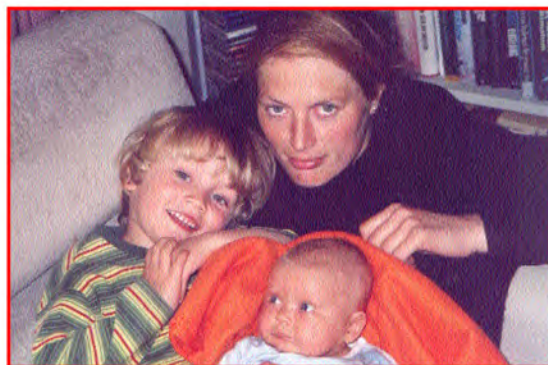

Memories of Joseph Don Somsen [2398]

*by his daughter Deanna Somsen-Adamson [2534] **

At a small family gathering the three living along with spouses and one grandchild of Joseph Don Somsen reminisced over a picnic.

We decided to send those memories on to our family magazine "Somsen Horizon"!



*Joseph Don Somsen (named: Don)
1918 - 1998*

Don Somsen was the youngest son of nine children born to Levi John Somsen [851] and Isabelle Maude Tanner [852]. Levi John was the second born son of Aaron John (Arent Jan) Somsen [753] and Antonia Jane Grooteboer [754].

As an adult, Don moved many times. He was born in Salt Lake City, Utah; but he lived in South America, Oklahoma, California, and several places in Utah. He bought a home in Sandy, Utah in about 1964, and lived there the rest of his life. In 1948, he moved his family to Venezuela to work for an oil company as manager of their commissary.

While living in South America, his wife made two trips to Oklahoma to deliver their two youngest children in the United States. The family moved back to the United States in 1952 and made their home in Sacramento, California. From there Don moved his family back to Utah in about 1956.

We all remember Dad's love of travel. His father, Levi, often took him on business trips with him. Dad told Deanna (third child) that Levi came one day and asked if Don would like to go on a trip with him. Don sure did! His Dad told him to get his toothbrush and climb in the car. They got everything else they needed as they traveled!

Dad told his son Max Leroy [2535] that when his parents (Levi and Isabelle) moved to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma for a new job, he (Don) decided not to go with them right away; but he took a train to see his brother Gene [2392] who was living in Southern California. When he said took a train, he meant he "rode the rails". He rode in empty boxcars, avoided the train security or "bulls," and saved his money for something else. He told Max that "riding the rails" was not so bad until the train had to go through a tunnel. At that point, all the black smoke from the coal burning engine would make its way into the boxcars.

Eventually, Dad made it to his parents' home in Oklahoma City, covered in black soot. When his father opened the front door, he took one look at Dad and said, "Get in here before the neighbors see you!"

Nearly every Sunday morning when Deanna and Max were young teenagers, Dad would come wake them up and say, "Mom and I are going for a drive, do you want to go?" Sometimes they joined their parents and other times they would opt for sleeping in. But it was more fun to go on the trips. Don would head some direction or other, visit a new site or one seen many times and then head home in a different direction. He hated returning on the same road. It seemed like a waste to him when he had already seen that scenery. Trips with Dad could be long or short. He would make up games as they went to keep them entertained

like "How far is it to that mountain top?" All could give a guess how many miles it was and when they got to the designated spot, whoever had the closest guess won. Of course, it was usually Dad. Another game was finding as many states on license plates as possible or finding letters A to Z on the signs and billboards along the highway and naming the alphabet in order. Longer trips might find them far from home at night and Dad would find a motel with a vacancy (and a swimming pool for the youngsters if they were lucky!).

Dad had a word he claimed he made up. We are not sure how to spell it, but it was something like "Rootalite". It meant anything that Dad wanted, and he would make up songs using that word as we drove along. Sharon [872], Don's oldest child, shared a fun memory. When she was about 15, she entered

a contest of some sort at a well-known local jewelry store. Sharon won the contest, and her prize was a small diamond. She told Dad about winning the diamond and promptly forgot about the whole thing. A few weeks later, imagine her surprise when Dad gave her a small box. In the box were two matching diamond earrings. Dad had gone to the jeweler, claimed her diamond and bought another one that nearly matched it, and had them put into earrings for his daughter. She loved them and wore them whenever she went to church. Many years later she lost one of the earrings. She loved those earrings and did not want to tell Dad she had lost one! So, she went to the same jeweler, and they helped her find another diamond and made another earring to match the remaining earring. She never told Dad about losing one of the earrings. Max Leroy Somsen [2535] writes:

"I was born the youngest of four children to Joseph Don Somsen and Dorothy Louise Roberts. Dad did not like to be called Joseph or Joe and we learned early in life if someone

asked for Joseph or old Joe, we knew that he was not a friend but someone who wanted to sell something to Dad. People could call him Don, or his good friends would call him JD. I never asked him how JD came about. Dad was in the grocery business all my life, and I worked with him for some time at the grocery store. That is where I learned if a salesperson came to the store and asked for "old Joe or Joseph" that even if Dad was in the store, the answer to the salesperson was "He's out," or "gone to the bank or lunch." Just not there at that time. Dad was not a salesman's friend. He did not buy to get whatever promotion was up for that week; and I do not think he would ever go to lunch with anyone but himself. I had the opportunity to work with Dad for a few years during my high school years and a couple after. I watched how he treated his employees, and he was kind and concerned for each of them, but he was very stern on how he managed the store; and he did not like slothful workers. You learned how to do things his way which was the right way. He was a very fair man to work for and in my life, I tried to be as fair as he was when I got into the position of management. I had learned there is a right way, wrong way, my way, and your way; and just because it was your way did not mean it was the wrong way it was simply different than how I would have done it. He was a great mentor, and one could learn a great deal from him. I am sure, like most children, we did not learn as much as we could have".

One of Deanna's (third child) favorite memories occurred when she was about twelve years old: "I invited Dad to a Father-Daughter activity at our church. Dad was not active in church and hardly knew anyone there. I was so happy when he said he would come. But I also worried he would change his mind, especially when he said he would be a little late. He said to go on over to the church and he would come as soon as he could. While I waited for him, I filled out a name tag for him. I started out

trying to write Joseph Don on the tag but ran out of space on the tag. It read "JOSEPH." I was so happy when he came in the door! I put his name tag on him, and we played games, danced, and ate dinner. Dad was addressed as Joe or Joseph all night long. It never occurred to me that it was a problem, Dad was pleasant to all and never let on how much he hated being called by that name. However, when we got home that night, he turned to me and demanded to know why I had written Joseph on that tag! He was not angry, just puzzled that I printed a name he never used! I never made that mistake again!"

Deanna remembers Don did not like messes of any kind. "I think sticky messes were his top dislikes. We had to be careful to wipe off syrup and honey containers after every meal because if he went to use those bottles and found they were sticky, he was very vocal in his complaints.

"Once the family was on vacation and stopped at a restaurant to have breakfast. The waitress accidentally knocked Dad's plate of pancakes covered with lots of butter and syrup into his lap! My younger brother and I looked at each other and we both had the same thought. Dad was going to 'blow his top' and our vacation would be over! Imagine our surprise when Dad told the waitress, who was very flustered and practically in tears, "Don't worry about it, I can change clothes." And he promptly left the table and did just that. We were amazed at his calm polite demeanor! (He was always very patient and kind to people in public).

Same vacation...

Dad's boss loaned him a nice RV for the trip. We usually just drove in our car wherever we went and stayed in motels and ate at restaurants. I do not remember more than two times that we went camping. Dad liked his comforts. But he thanked his boss, and we started off on a new adventure in that big rolling 'motel.' Dad still stopped every night

and stayed in a motel! We had a perfectly nice restroom in the RV, but Dad did not let us use it! We had to laugh when he described climbing under the vehicle to find the waste disposal valve, pulling the lever and running to avoid the mess! We all knew it would work differently than that, but Dad was adamant about the situation. When we stopped for gas for the RV, we used the facilities at the station! It was a fun trip, just not as we expected it to be."

Don Allen Somsen [873] (second child, deceased 2022) told his wife Susan Tolley [2543] that Dad loved to play canasta, a card game. Don Allen said they played often, and he was pleased when he was able to win Dad! Don also told Susan many times how much he idolized his Dad Joseph Don and loved working with him at the grocery store. He also said that any time he needed a job for any reason, all he had to do was call Dad; and Dad would hire him to work at the grocery store with him. One of Don Allen's favorite memories he told Susan many times was about going to an old-fashioned drug store in Tonkawa, Oklahoma with his dad. He was just a little boy and he remembered going to this drug store several times. It had a soda fountain where Dad would put Don up on a high seat at the counter and order him a chocolate malt. The proper way to make a chocolate malt according to Dad (and Don) was with hard vanilla ice cream (not the soft kind and not chocolate), chocolate syrup and two scoops of malt. The drink had to be made so it would be sipped with a straw. If it was too thick, they sent it back and asked for it to be thinner. Don Allen loved those times with his Dad and all his life he loved looking for old drug stores with soda fountains and he always insisted on malts made the way Dad had.

We all have great memories of Joseph Don (Dad) Somsen.

His beloved wife, Dorothy, passed away in April 1981.

In September 1981 Dad married Betty Catherine Roberts, Dorothy's younger sister. She and Don were married for 17 years. Having an aunt become your stepmother is interesting. Don Allen delighted in calling her his aunt stepmom, and he would occasionally throw in "wicked aunt stepmom" just for fun. Betty just laughed. After they married, Dad and Betty went to Idaho to visit Deanna.

Betty had a 3-year-old son, Jeremy, who knew his grandma Dorothy quite well. He had been told that grandma had passed away and was with the angels and understood that. Aunt Betty looked so much like her older sister that when she walked in, she faced a confused little boy and explanations were in order! All of Deanna's children grew up with Grandma Betty and loved her very much. The whole family was happy Dad had found a companion and was no

longer alone. He worked as a groceryman clear to the time of his death in July 1998...

Jan and Anna in Baldwin, Wisconsin (part 3, conclusion)

Jan and Anna Somsen-Kemink [352-353] from Amsterdam visited in 1949 the full cousins of Jan Willem Somsen. Descendants of the Somsens from the Achterhoek (Gelderland) who once emigrated to the United States.

Jan and Anna kept a diary during this nearly three-month period:

May 31 – August 22, 1949.

In this episode, you will find a selection of their final experiences in Baldwin and surroundings.

Wednesday, July 13, 1949

Cousin Willem and Raymond arrived by car around a quarter past seven, and together we went to St. Paul [MN] to visit the global corporation of which Dr. Mr. Daniels is president. He was formerly the U.S. envoy to Belgium.

We took the elevator to the 13th floor, where we were brought to the company's Chief Representative, who introduced us to the Dutch consul, a 70-year-old man, born in Amsterdam, who has lived here in Minneapolis for 47 years and is a naturalized American. A genuine Amsterdammer, which delighted this imitation-Mokummer. We had an exceptionally good time.

Mr. Daniels officially saw us off again, after which we were given a tour of the large offices where the machines were rattling.

Then in a beautiful Chrysler to the factories,

where the grains are received, milled, sorted, weighed, packaged, and shipped—all automatically. Amazing! A press photographer was present and took several pictures of us in the facility.

Friday, July 15, 1949

In the town of Hastings [MN], we had a cup of coffee with cake in a lunchroom. The service was very proper. A female counter attendant who served us looked at us and listened intently as we spoke. She looked so sad and seemed very nervous. She turned out to be German, from Wiesbaden, living here since November 1, 1948, married to an American soldier, and thus came here. She missed her homeland so much and longed to see her parents, brothers, and sisters again. It did her good that we could speak German with her.

Monday, July 25, 1949

Home around noon and then to bed. It's warm in bed, and I keep tossing and turning. As a result, I roll out of bed, which causes much giggling in the bedrooms. Anna and the nieces had a great laugh. Fortunately, I wasn't seriously hurt, but I received no sympathy at all.

Wednesday, July 27, 1949

This afternoon we went to the farm of cousin and niece Wernlund, where we arrived around 3 o'clock. Jan Wernlund bought this farm from his parents. We were received in a neat room. More and more female relatives arrived by car. It became quite a gathering: 15 women, young and old, were present. Arlene Wernlund came to us and pinned a beautiful bouquet on Anna's left chest, while I received a lovely carnation, with the request to open all the packages they had brought for us.

Friday, July 29, 1949

At home, Mina and Willem Wernlund and their daughter came to say goodbye, as did Rev. Muyskens and Albert Somsen's daughter Evelyn, who is married to Doyle Tousley and

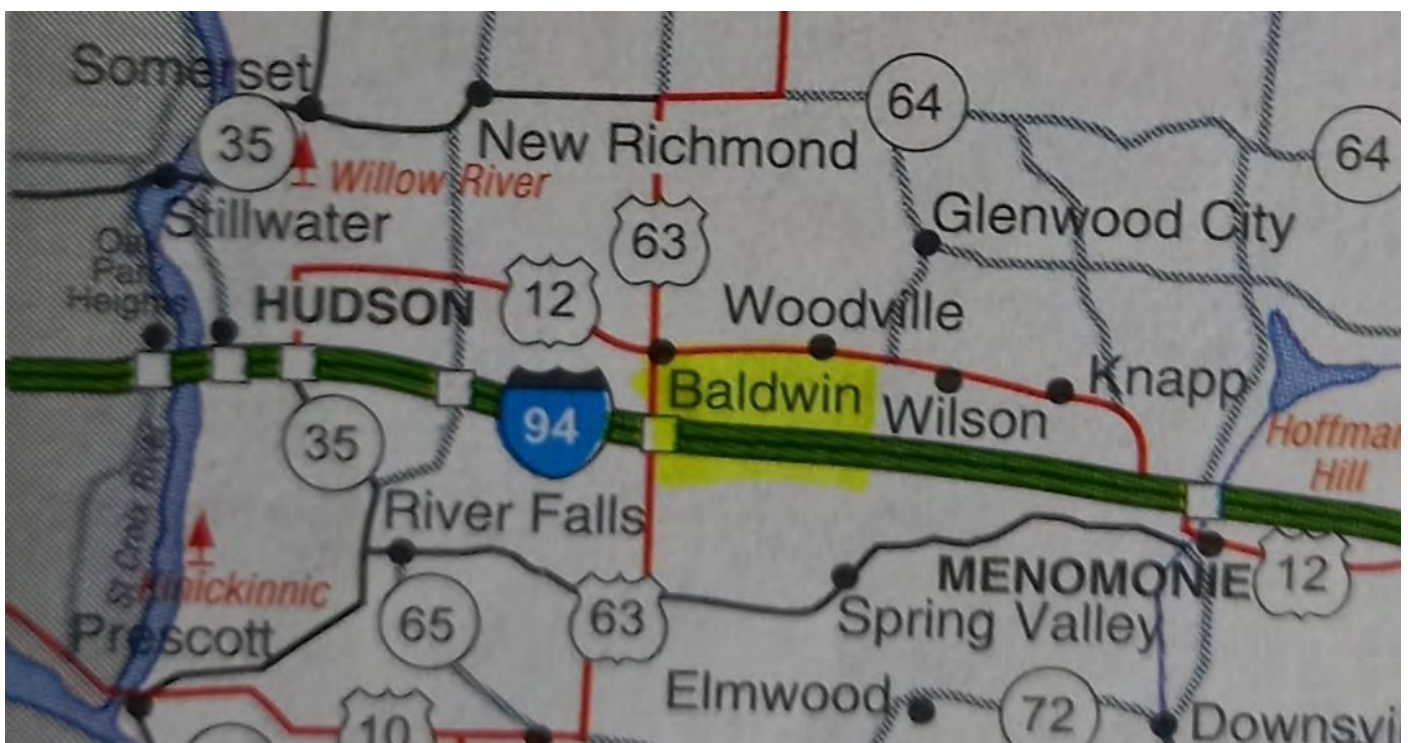
lives in Chatfield (Minnesota). During the war, Doyle stayed at cousin Bernard's house in Arnhem.

Saturday, July 30, 1949

Got up at 3 a.m. because cousin Raymond was coming to pick us up around 4. Everyone was present, and after breakfast, we said goodbye to Ella and Herman, which was not easy after such wonderful days.

At a quarter past four, the car was at the door, and after a final farewell to them and to Baldwin, we headed to cousin Willem and his wife in Woodville. When we arrived, everyone was already up. The suitcases were packed, and the car was loaded. Now the farewell to this family: Willem, Geertrui, and cousin Betsy (who treated us to chocolates for her third wedding anniversary). It was hard for all of us to say goodbye, as they had also been so especially warm and generous to us. We had taken many trips with them and enjoyed many good things.

One last wave, and we disappeared from their sight.



Here ends their visit to the Somsen relatives in Baldwin and surroundings. Afterwards, they spent another two weeks visiting other family and acquaintances in places like Chicago, Grand Haven, and Grand Rapids.

On Monday, August 15, they boarded a ship, departed from New York, and arrived safely in Rotterdam on Monday, August 22.

On August 24, 1949, Jan Somsen completed their diary, which consists of 54 typed A4 pages.

I was able to draw from it with great pleasure!
